
Found Out Kitchener

Each phrase is a set of words that is opposite(somewhat) from a title or portion of a title of a work by a UWaterloo alumn. The authors first names can be used to help confirm the tittle. Searching the translated phrase in the UWaterloo library database provides call numbers. Placing the call numbers on the book spines gives another call number in the boxed spots. The UWaterloo library can be searched by call number. This leads to a work by another UWaterloo alumn, and the title fits in the blanks on the bottom. The boxed word is mall. The opposite of the title is Lost In Waterloo and the mall in Waterloo is Conestoga.
